

**TO OPEN BRANCH HERE.—Mr. Tancrede Brevennu, Vice-President of the bank and Mr. Maurice Larose, Chief Inspector of the Provincial Bank of Canada are in Charlottetown concluding arrangements for the opening of a branch of the Bank here in the premises recently occupied by L. J. Reiddin. It is also the intention to open a branch in Summerside. This Bank has 88 branches in Canada. The President is Sir H. Laporte, P. C., who was President of the war purchasing Committee at Ottawa, during the war, and is a Director of the Canadian National Railway Board.**

Isadore M. Mullin died at Los Angeles, California, Nov. 19, 1918. He was taken to the hospital Nov. 12 with influenza which developed into pneumonia. He had the best medical skill available and a special trained nurse, and although he was cheerful and made a good fight, he succumbed to the fell destroyer, death.

Rev. Lawrence Louergan, O. S. B., the Catholic Chaplain was in daily attendance.

His body was brought to his native home in Kensington, P. E. I., and interment took place at Indian River on Dec. 4. The Mass of Requiem was sung by Rev. J. J. MacDonald, Kin-kora, and the services at the grave were performed by the pastor, Rev. Mgr. Gillis. A delegation from the Knights of Columbus, Charlottetown Council, attended the funeral, deces-

ed being a member of Vancouver's Council, and last year Chancellor where he was held in high esteem by all the members. The pall bearers were Peter McIver, Eugene McIver, Linus Gorman, Fred Mullaly, Duff Hynes and Joseph Higgins. Isadore Mullin was a young man of exceptional ability, as his successful career in life amply testifies. He was successively Principal of Margate graded school, Tignish High School and Kensington High School.

Seven years ago he went to Vancouver, B. C., where he proved a thoroughly competent teacher, being for the past four years vice principal of Dawson School, the largest and best school in B. C. He entered the College of Dentistry, University of Southern California, last September and in October joined the Students' Army Training Corps of that Institution.

He leaves to mourn his father, John T. Mullin and sister Minnie, and brother Emmet at home, Mrs. Jas. A. Ready, Kensington, Mrs. John T. Burns, Chelsea, Mass., and Corporal John T., now convalescing from wounds in 1st Birmingham War Hospital, Rednal, England.—It.
