I received your very welcome letter to day I
didn't know what in the world happened to you.
Will Lupton old boy I had a haul. Since
I last wrote you got back the fifth of this month
had five days leave I was glad to hear you were
still living and well. I had a wire from home
last Friday saying officially reported missing
Joseph Charles McSur. Since the 18th Nov. Alexander
Mc. You met him in Denmark. He was stationed
in Iceland. I don't know if he was killed or
perhaps a prisoner of war. I guess time will tell.
I hear from the wife quite often. She was asking
she and the little boy are fine. She was asking
me in her last letter if I had heard from you
lately. I heard from Howard. Not so very long
ago. He had a little trolley into a Car with
his horse and Wagon coming from Ch town
broke a wheel and shafts. I am glad to hear
you are getting your mail more regular. For a
person sure likes to get mail when so far away
from home, was away on week-end this past
week. they are having quite a time with the
Zombies back home. I guess they will soon
have conscription for they seem to be short on
scout of them. So Sgt Contwell is in Windsor.
He was a bad guy a Chap. The wife was telling
Mr. Fred Ronahan was in Jibert ready to come
ourselves any time so it must
