Four Persons Killed On Weekend in N.H.

Four persons died in traffic accidents in New Hampshire during the weekend — including three in one accident — raising the state's fatality toll for the year, already a record, to 168.

Killed in a two-car crash on Route 101 in Auburn Saturday were Miss Bertha McKenna, 71, and her sister Miss Pauline

McKenna, 59, both of Manchester, and Philip Bouchard, 28, of Rochester.

The cars collided at the intersection of Route 101 and Hooksett Road. Laura McKenna, 77, another sister, was hospitalized.

Nine-year-old Michael Anderson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Mahoney of Manchester, died of injuries sustained Sunday when he was struck by a car as he ran across the Everett Turnpike in Manchester. Mahoney was the child's stepfather, State Police said. The driver of the car said the child jumped a dividing fence on the median strip of the expressway and into the path of the vehicle.
