

Donald C. O'Regan Dies Suddenly In Washington

CARIBOU, July 30—Relatives and friends of Donald O'Regan, 42, were saddened at the news of his death which occurred at the Gallinger hospital, Washington, D. C., Tuesday, July 24, after a short illness. Funeral services were held in New York City, Saturday. Interment was at the Gates of Heavenly Rest in New York City.

He was born in Berlin, N. H., Nov. 19, 1902, son of the late Michael and Zita O'Regan. Coming to Caribou with his parents four years later.

Mr. O'Regan was a graduate of the Caribou high school, University of Maine, where he was a member of the Sigma Chi, then went to Washington, where he graduated from Georgetown Law school. After his graduation from law school, he was appointed special assistant to the United States attorney general, working on settlements of war contracts. Before returning to Caribou he was with the law firm of Lybrand, Ross Bros. and Montgomery for a year, specializing on income tax returns.

While in Caribou, he practiced law and served as judge of the municipal court for a few years.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Hope Hunck of New York City and Mrs. Harriet Texido of Houlton.
