Mr. O'Regan has been employed in the Admiralty Law Division of the Shipping Board and recently was assigned to assist Senator Bert M. Fernald in drafting the Cape Cod Canal Purchase bill. It was upon the recommendation of Senators Fernald and Hale and Representative A. G. Hersey that his appointment to the Department of Justice was made.

Mr. O'Regan, who is only 21 years of age, received his early education in the public schools of this town and graduated from Caribou High school in 1919. He attended the University of Maine for 2 years after which he entered Georgetown University, in Washington, D. C., graduating from the Law School in 1924. He was admitted to the Maine bar and later passed the bar examination and was admitted to practice in the District of Columbia.

O'Regan and has two sisters and a brother, Miss Hope O'Regan who is a stenographer for the Keene Ice Cream Co., Bangor; Harriet O'Regan who is training for a nurse in the Medigan Hospital in Houlton and Douglas O'Regan who is attending Bryant & Stratton's Business College in Boston.
